Purling London is a purveyor of contemporary, luxury chess sets that contrast traditional hand-carved Staunton pieces against abstract, modern art. The unique chess sets are hand-painted by British-based contemporary artists and are as much fine hardwood, strikingly colored sculptures, as they are part of a professional grade, 34-piece, triple-weighted playable board game. 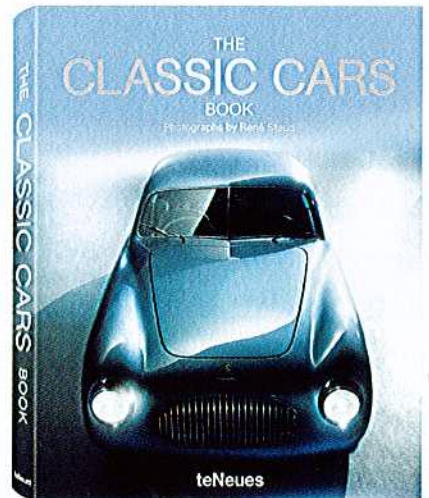
3. CUE THE FLOWERS

The Pinocchio Billiard tumbler vase comes by its name most naturally. With a long nose, and a curious manner, if it falls down it immediately gets up. Offered in an array of classic billiard ball colors, the tumbler is cheeky, cheerful, unpretentious, and the perfect addition to your billiards or rec room. Designed by Philipp Bruni rather than Geppetto the woodcarver, Pinocchio is not carved of wood but made of the most precious, handmade Viennese porcelain from Augarten. www.stillfried.com

An interpretation of Salvador Dalí's 1943 painting "Geopoliticus Child Watching the Birth of the New Man" by artist Giuseppe Miniero adorns this beautiful limited edition wood winder case. One of only 100 cases from Orbita's 2014 Artisan Collection, exceptional in quality and appearance, the Intarsia design method used by Miniero on "Birth of the New Man" involves hundreds of tiny pieces of wood carefully fitted together in a puzzle-like assembly that requires up to 25 different exotic wood varieties to create each scene.
